water frolicking, and of course lot of sunshine, which could have been done away with. But Sunshine can never dampen spirit, no matter how high the mercury is, isn't it?

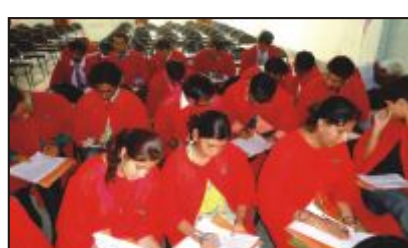


## Teaching the Taught or helping them Learn
